# Lincoln Early Music Courses

The Loud Wind course is a one-day event which will be following on from a day's course for the Lincoln Waites on April 24th. It is open to all players of shawms, sackbuts, and similar instruments, and percussion. The music studied will be mainly from the late 15<sup>th</sup> and early 16<sup>th</sup> centuries, and will be of particular interest to waites groups.

**Keith McGowan**'s association with Shakespeare's Globe began in the opening season as a musician in *Henry V*. As well as playing, Keith has since directed music at the Globe on a number of productions and has toured with them to Japan and the USA. He directs his own shawm ensemble and is a visiting Professor of Renaissance wind at the Royal Academy of Music. Keith has conducted research into the history and techniques of ceremonial wind music and plays shawm, cornett, sackbut, renaissance flute and curtal.

John Dowland (?1563 – 1626) epitomises secular Elizabethan court music. This course is suitable for singers, lutenists, viol players and recorder players, and will include both vocal and instrumental music.

**Stewart McCoy** has a Master's degree in historical musicology from Kings College, London. As a performer of plucked instruments he is known internationally, as well as having played for the Royal Shakespeare Company, and he tutors regularly on renaissance courses.

Ludwig Sennfl (1489/91 — 1543) is gradually being recognised as one of the finest and most versatile composers of the early 16th century. On the course we will be discovering the delights of German tenorlieder, (both sacred and decidedly secular), motets, mass propers and instrumental music. Those who have attended the previous Sennfl courses will find little duplication of material. The weekend will include a simple Bavarian-style meal without the excesses of last year!

**Philip Thorby** needs little in the way of introduction: for many years he has held a reputation for excellence in many fields of early music. He has a particular sympathy with Sennfl and his contemporaries and is a well-known and charismatic tutor.
